Covid-19 Policy and Protocols  
Updated January 20, 2021

This policy was made in consultation with Dr. Wesley Willeford from the Jefferson County Department of Health and is a living document.

- Masks must be worn at all times by girls and staff when visiting any location on campus outside of their primary residence. This includes the administrative offices, Campus School building, or any public setting. Masks must be worn by all girls and staff throughout the school day.
- Volunteers and social workers must wear a mask prior to entering any building on the Grace House campus and must remain masked the entire time. Social workers must have an appointment scheduled with the Residential Program staff.
- Temperatures of girls, staff, and visitors must be taken using the provided contact-free thermometers on a daily basis. All temperatures are recorded in writing. Abnormal temperatures should be reported to your supervisor.
- Any person showing symptoms or with a known exposure to COVID-19 has access to testing through our partnership with Children's Urgent Care.
- Continue to follow stringent cleaning and sanitizing procedures in the homes and reinforce proper hygiene practices for the girls.
